Very early on Sunday morning they took the ointments to the tomb and found that the huge stone covering the entrance had been rolled aside. So they went in—but the Lord Jesus' body was gone.

They stood there puzzled, trying to think what could have happened to it. Suddenly two men appeared before them, clothed in shining robes so bright their eyes were dazzled. The women were terrified and bowed low before them.

FOOD SHARING PROGRAM

- The first Sunday of every month is Loaves and Fishes Sunday. Please consider bringing a donation of non-perishable food items with you to help Sunshine Cathedral's Food Sharing Ministry. All donations are greatly appreciated and make a big difference in people's lives.

KEEP IT COVERED

– Sunshine Cathedral asks that you continue to reserve your seat at Sunshinecathedral.org if you wish to worship onsite, and we insist that you wear a mask at all times while you are here. Hopefully we are in the last months of needing these protocols, but for the present time, we will continue to follow these guidelines to keep everyone safe.

ECUMENISM

- Sunshine Cathedral is affiliated with the International Council of Community Churches (which is a member of the World and National Councils of Churches), Metropolitan Community Churches, the Global Justice Institute (at MCC New York), the Divine Science Federation (of which our senior minister is president), and BOLD Justice (a Broward County network of churches working together with government and community leaders for a kinder and more just life for all in our county). In relationship and partnership we can achieve so much.

HOUT TV

- Happening Out TV produces It's Happening Out (weekly), Gay Town Hall (weekly), Sunshine Cathedral Sunday Worship (weekly), and Queer News Tonight (weeknights) Happening Out Television Network is a streaming network that produces LGBTQ+ themed news and social programming. Look for Happening Out TV on Facebook and YouTube. The Network studio is now on the campus of the Sunshine Cathedral.

GLOBAL RELIGIOUS SPRING FESTIVALS IN APRIL 2021

4 April (Sunday) EASTER DAY Christian (Western Churches) - Easter Day is the most important festival of the Christian year, as it is when Christians celebrate the resurrection of Jesus. Many Easter traditions, such as the giving of chocolate Easter eggs symbolize the gift of new life.

8 April (Thursday) HANAMATSURI Buddhist (Japanese) - Mahayana flower festival to celebrate the Buddha Shakyamuni's birthday. Shrines are erected and an image of the infant Buddha is bathed.

8 April (Thursday) YOM HA-SHOAH (Holocaust Day) Jewish - A day of remembrance for the victims of the Nazi Holocaust. Memorial candles are lit and special services are held.

13 April (Tuesday) to 12 May (Wednesday) RAMADAN Muslim - Ramadan is the 9th month of the Islamic Calendar, when the Prophet received the first revelation of verses of the Qur'an. It is the holiest month for Muslims, and they dedicate themselves to spiritual renewal, prayer and intensive devotional reading of the Qur'an. During the month of Ramadan Muslims are required to fast from daybreak until after sunset. No food or drink may be consumed during the hours of fasting, and those fasting must also abstain from smoking and from sexual relations. After the custom of the Prophet, the fast is traditionally broken each evening by taking dates and water.

20 April (Tuesday) - 1 May (Saturday) RIDVAN Baha'i - The most important Baha'i festival. In these 12 days, in the garden outside Baghdad after which the festival is named, Baha'u'llah declared himself the Promised One, prophesied by the Bab. The first, ninth and twelfth days are especially significant and are holy days, when no work is done. It is during this period that Baha'is elect all their governing bodies.

21 April (Wednesday) RAMA NAVAMI Hindu - The birthday of Rama, the seventh avatar of Vishnu, is celebrated at noon in the aarti ceremony, performed in front of a doll or of a picture depicting Rama swinging in a cradle.

21 April (Wednesday) ADAR MAH PARAB Zoroastrian (Parsi) - On the ninth day of Adar, the 9th month, Zoroastrians celebrate the birthday of fire. They pay visits to the fire temple to make offerings of sandalwood or incense, and to thank the holy fire for the warmth and light it has given throughout the year.

30 April (Thursday) BELTAINE Wiccan/Pagan/Druid - The wheel of the year continues to turn and fertile spring yields to the height of summer. Many pagans celebrate Beltaine by lighting fires or with maypole dances, symbolizing the mystery of the Sacred Marriage of Goddess and God.

SAINTS OF THE WEEK

April 4: Martin Luther King, Jr. (1929-1968)

—Apostle of freedom and renewer of society. Martin earned first a Bachelor's degree from Morehouse College, then a Master's degree from Crozier Divinity School, and finally a Ph.D. in Theology from Boston University. Later he was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize in 1964. He was the spiritual leader of the modern Civil Rights movement. Inspired by the example of Gandhi, he led a campaign of nonviolent resistance to racial segregation, racism and poverty. He is best remembered for his famous "I Have a Dream" speech given at the Lincoln Memorial in Washington. He was repeatedly jailed and in 1968 he was assassinated in Memphis, TN.

April 7: Ernest Holmes (1887-1960)

– Founder of Religious Science. Holmes was an influential figure in the New Thought movement. After studying philosophy and world religions independently, working with his brother who was a Congregational minister, and becoming ordained in the Divine Science movement, Holmes wrote *The Science of Mind* (among several books) and started the Religious Science Church. In *The Art of Life*, Holmes instructed, "When you pray or affirm your good, close the door of your consciousness to everything which denies this good and state your needs, not as a supplication but as an affirmation of acceptance...We shall not gain happiness by continuing to repeat mental patterns of unhappiness...Can we, in the midst of negative conditions, accept a great good? If we can we shall be complying with the Law of Life. We shall be giving Life a chance to work for us."

Fenwicke Holmes (1883 – 1973)

- Earned a B.A. from Colby College and attended Hartford Seminary and was ordained a Congregationalist minister (and later, a Divine Science minister). In addition to assisting his brother (Ernest Holmes) in the Science of Mind movement, he also served as the pastor of a Divine Science church. He was helpful in spreading New Thought philosophy in Japan through his collaboration with Seicho-No-Ie's founder, Masaharu Taniguchi. Fenwicke's books include: *Being & Becoming* (1925), *The Law of Mind in Action* (1926), and *The Truth About Matter* (1944). He wrote a poem in the divine voice: "I am thy life within thee, I am thy health; I am thy choicest treasure, I am thy wealth. I am thy deepest wisdom, I am thy light; I am thy power within thee, I am thy might. I am thy warm emotion, I am thy truth; I am thy ageless heritage, I am thy youth. I am thy hope of heaven, I am the way; I am the light eternal, I am the day. I am thy will-to-conquer, I am thy sword; I am the peace thou cravest, I am thy word...I am the Inner Presence, Forever nigh – Whenever thou dost say, 'I am': I AM That I."

April 8: Sidhartha Gautama, the Buddha (circa 560 – 480 BCE)

– Buddha means "Awakened." He was born in what is today Nepal and he died in India. The Buddha is said to have had a dramatic experience whereby he became "awake" (or enlightened), and then set about teaching others how they, too, could learn to live as fully awake beings. Many Buddhists speak of the "Buddha Nature" that is latent within

all of us; as we achieve enlightenment (or awakening), we express that Buddha Nature. The Buddha is regarded as the model, or supreme Buddha, but others have been thought to achieve enlightenment. Compare this to the belief that some have that Jesus demonstrates the Christ Principle that is latent within all people.

The Buddha taught that suffering is caused by ignorance. Attachment and craving are symptoms of ignorance. By learning the Truth (and practicing what we learn), we can change our thoughts and attitudes, that is, we can control our cravings and thereby limit suffering. Buddha taught and practiced meditation and gave an 8-fold righteous path to follow, which included right understanding, right thinking, right speech, and right action.

April 9: Dietrich Bonhoeffer (1906-1945)

—Theologian and martyr. Bonhoeffer was deeply committed to the ideals of Christian community. He helped organize resistance to the Nazi takeover of German churches. When the Confessing Church movement was snuffed out he was imprisoned for his participation in the plot to kill Hitler. Influenced by the Social Gospel movement in America, he later wrote in prison of the need for a "religionless Christianity." His writings have been a major influence on Christian Ethics in our time. Some have speculated that Bonhoeffer's well known affection for his dear friend Eberhard Behge suggests a possible gay orientation.

James Dillet Freeman (1912-2003)

– The "Poet Laureate" of the Unity School of Christianity. He composed the prayer: "The Light of God surrounds us; the love of God enfolds us. The power of God protects us; the presence of God watches over us. Wherever we are, God is!" Not only is that prayer used in the Sunshine Cathedral liturgy (and in New Thought centers everywhere), it was taken to the moon in 1969!

April 10: Kahlil Gibran (1883 – 1931)

- Was born in Ottoman Syria (now Lebanon) and was the grandson of a Maronite Catholic priest. The Gibran family moved from the Middle East to Boston (USA) where he flourished as a poet, artist, and philosopher. He later studied in Paris and lived in NYC where he wrote and painted. His most famous work is *The Prophet*. His writings were very popular in the counter-cultural movement of the 1960s. Here are some of his inspiring words: "All that spirits desire, spirits attain", "An eye for an eye, and the whole world would be blind", "Beauty is eternity gazing at itself in a mirror", "Faith is a knowledge within the heart, beyond the reach of proof", and "I existed from all eternity and, behold, I am here; and I shall exist till the end of time, for my being has no end."

Pierre Teilhard de Chardin (1881-1955)

—Mystic and scientist. A French Jesuit priest, Teilhard was both one of the most creative theological minds of the 20th century and an imminent scientist. He did extensive work in geology and paleontology in China, helping to discover the remains of "Peking Man." He sought to develop a synthesis of science and religion, integrating the theory of evolution with a cosmic vision of Christ at the heart of the cosmos. His writings, seminal to the development of Process Theology, were suppressed by the Vatican during his lifetime.

Rachel, who is also an important figure in Christianism and Islam, was the favorite of Jacob's two wives, and the mother of Joseph and Benjamin, two of the twelve progenitors of the tribes of Israel.



Visit Yad Vashem

Continue to Yad Vashem Museum, Israel's official memorial to the victims of the Holocaust. Yad Vashem is located on the western slope of Mount Herzl on the Mount of Remembrance in Jerusalem. The memorial consists of a 45 acre complex containing the Holocaust History Museum, memorial sites such as the Children's Memorial and the Hall of Remembrance, The Museum of Holocaust Art, Sculptures and more.

At the beginning of the great revolt against Rome in the year 68 CE, Masada was conquered by a group of Jewish zealots, and Masada became their last stronghold. In the year 72, the Romans besieged Masada and succeeded in reaching the steep fortress after constructing a huge earthen ramp on its western side. In the year 73, the 960 Jewish zealots living at the top of Masada chose to commit suicide rather than to fall into the hands of the Romans alive. Their deeds left behind a saga of courage, heroism, and martyrdom.
