A Reading from the Fourth Gospel

(John 11.17-25, 35-36, 38-44; John 14.5-6)

When Jesus arrived [to visit Lazarus, Mary, and Martha], he learned that Lazarus had already been in the tomb for four days. Now Bethany was near Jerusalem, about two miles distant, and many from the religious community had come to Martha and Mary to console them for the loss of their brother.

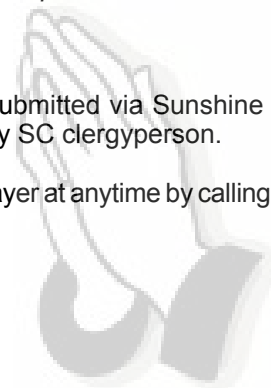

SAINTS OF THE WEEK

July 20: St. Wilgefortis – a noblewoman who was a devout Christian. Wilgefortis' father betrothed her to a non-Christian king. One night she prayed to be spared from the marriage and the next morning she woke to discover he had a full beard. The king canceled the wedding, and her father, furious, had Wilgefortis crucified. Wilgefortis is considered a "folk saint." Wilgefortis is embraced by some who self-identify as transgender, gender queer, gender non-conforming, or intersex because the story of Wilgefortis challenges to gender binary norms.

July 21: Albert Luthuli (1898-1967)—Zulu chief, Nobel laureate. An important early leader in the struggle against apartheid, Luthuli was a Zulu chief raised in a Christian home. He became a principle leader in the African National Congress, and was frequently imprisoned for leading strikes and boycotts, and burning his passbook. In 1960 he was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize.

July 22: St. Mary Magdalene—"Apostle to the Apostles." Mary of Magdala (near Capernaum) was one of a group of women who traveled and worked with Jesus. The Gospels report Jesus healed her by casting out seven evil spirits. Her life was forever changed, and she followed him all the way to the cross, even when the men had fled in fear. She has long been the subject of sacred art and literature, and been an important model for the leadership and role of women in the church. She reminds us that there were many women leaders among Jesus' first followers. Despite later myths, there is nothing in the bible to indicate she had been a prostitute.

Arts & Education - Concerts, standup comics, film showings, cabaret shows, guest speakers, panels, affordable religious education courses, streaming broadcast of our worship services, and a strong social media presence all offer hope, joy, and empowerment to our local and global community.

Employment - SC employs full time, half time, and stipendiary professionals

Food sharing - Every Wednesday we provide brown bag lunches to individuals and community service organizations and we give bags of groceries to those who need a bit of assistance. We feed over 600 people every week.

Justice work - SC contributes regularly to the Global Justice Institute, a ministry housed at Metropolitan Community Church of New York City. GJI offers encouragement and aid to LGBTQ+ people in Eastern Europe, Latin America, the Caribbean, Asia, and East Africa, even helping some individuals relocate when their lives are threatened because of who they are or what they do.

SC participates with *BOLD-Justice* (Broward Organized Leaders Doing Justice), a local consortium of churches that work with county and state government on various issues such as fairer sentencing for first time offenders and better care in facilities for the elderly.

Property maintenance - SC works closely with the Sunshine Cathedral Foundation to maintain and improve the physical property, manage capital campaigns, and invest in the long-term health of Sunshine Cathedral.

Space sharing - SC is able to provide and often subsidize safe and affordable space for various community organizations such as recovery, youth, and support groups, the Gay Men's Chorus of South Florida, Happening Out Television Network, the McArtor Senior Center, and more.

Worship - Some of the most relevant, joyful, celebratory, progressive, uplifting worship, blending ancient traditions with pop culture, sacred texts from many traditions, sacred and secular music, expository preaching, affirmative prayer, and communion with the omnipresent Love that we call God is experienced at the Sunshine Cathedral. Our dynamic worship is broadcast live on Facebook and YouTube. VR services are offered in Second Life each week as well.

All of this and more is made possible because of the loving and prayerful financial support of those who call Sunshine Cathedral their spiritual home. And still, we want to get better and do more. And so we ask those who can to give above and beyond their regular tithes and offerings. We offer several projects and programs one might wish to support beyond one's regular giving.
