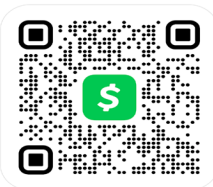

WEDNESDAYS IN LENT - (Mar 9 - Apr 13) online Lenten series presented by Rev. Barbara Essex (Wednesday at 6 pm on our Facebook page).

LENTEN FOOD DRIVE - We ask the Sunshine Cathedral community to bring non-perishable food donations for the Food Sharing Ministry on Sundays in Lent to help replenish our food pantry. Please see any Loaves and Fishes team member for a list of suggested items.

WORSHIP WITH US EVERY SUNDAY IN LENT - Lent is a season of spiritual growth and renewal. Worship with us on Sundays, join us for Midday Prayer on Facebook Monday - Saturday at Noon eastern, and again on Wednesday evenings at 6 pm eastern for our Lenten study.

HOLY WEEK – Palm Sunday: 9 am & 10:30 am (10:30 also live streamed). Maundy Thursday: Special Service at 7 pm (live streamed only). Good Friday: Special Musical Event at 7 pm at Sunshine Cathedral Square (also live streamed). Easter Sunday: 9 am & 10:30 am (10:30 also live streamed).

EASTER LILIES - are what we call special donors who give above and beyond their regular donations to make Easter extra special. Gifts are given in memory or in honor of loved ones whose names will be included in the Easter bulletin. If you'd like to be a 2022 Easter Lily, envelopes are available in the Worship Center.

SAGE – Friendly Visitor Program for LGBTQ seniors at Sunshine Cathedral - the program has been under development and now has a coordinator: Mitchell Zahn. Mitchell has over 35 years of experience with community-based organizations and government agencies, including work with older adults and people living with HIV. He also has had volunteer management experience, and has done a bunch of volunteering himself. Mitchell begins the week of April 4th. More information about this exciting new program will be coming soon.

WELLNESS - At Sunshine Cathedral Square, you can receive **Covid testing** 7 days per week, **STI testing** twice per month (1st & 3rd Tuesdays 5 pm - 8 pm courtesy of Broward House), **food assistance** on Wednesdays (until about 1 pm), and grief support twice a month (contact Rev. Dr. Anne Atwell about the grief support group). Condoms are available in our restrooms, vaccinations are encouraged and hand sanitizer can be found at the doorways of the Worship Center.

BOLD Justice - If you are passionate about social justice and want to support the Sunshine Cathedral's Justice Ministry, please join us on Monday, April 4 for the Nehemiah action. We are trying to get as many people as possible from the Sunshine Cathedral at this event. We are working on three major issues in our Broward

Community.

- Criminal Justice reform; Civil citations vs. Arrest in minor offenses. Our work has seen 23,225 fewer children in Florida arrested saving the state more than \$104 million.

- Care for Creation – Climate impacts on communities in Broward County and ways to alleviate these effects of the heat index, rising costs of utility bills, and the rising sea level which is specially of interest to us here in Broward.

- Permanent Supportive Housing is a housing model that provides rental assistance and supportive services to people with mental health issues who have experienced long-term or repeated homelessness. Services include mental health treatment, physical health care, education, financial literacy education, employment opportunities and peer coaching.

WOMEN'S HISTORY MONTH – Sister Thea Bowman, Servant of God, is one of our Saints of the Week, and she is also a great role model to highlight for Women's History Month. Sister Thea Bowman, FSPA, lovingly taught young people about the joy of being Christian, she challenged her church to accept her as “fully black and fully Catholic,” she embraced her suffering with a willing spirit and she called all to a living faith. Though not a priest, she was nevertheless a powerful preacher. A few weeks before she died, she said, “We unite ourselves with Christ's redemptive work when we reconcile, when we make peace, when we share the good news that God is in our lives, when we reflect to our brothers and sisters God's healing, God's forgiveness, God's unconditional love.”

TODAY'S CONTEMPORARY READING – is by Ida B. Elliott. Ida was the niece of Divine Science founder Malinda Elliot Cramer and was ordained by the secondary Divine Science founder, Nona Brooks. Ida's

ministry was in Oakland, CA. She was a writer and on one project worked with Ernest Holmes.

SAINTS OF THE WEEK

March 27: Meister Eckhart (1260-1329)—Dominican theologian and mystic. Eckhart's writings were largely condemned in his lifetime, however he is today seen as a prophet of modern spirituality. He wrote in mystical and paradoxical terms of the union of the soul with God, of a God-consciousness that is attained only by emptying and detachment. His thoughts show many similarities to Zen Buddhism. He liked to say "Do not cling to the symbols, but get to the inner truth!"

March 28: Katherine Lee Bates, (Aug 12, 1859 – Mar 28, 1929) - author of "America the Beautiful," was a lesbian.

March 29: Emmanuel Swedenborg (1688 – 1772) – Swedish scientist, philosopher, and Christian mystic. His writings influenced William Blake, Elizabeth Barrett Browning, Ralph Waldo Emerson, Balzac, and Helen Keller. His writings also offer the theological framework for the Swedenborgian Church.

March 30: Maimonides (1135 – 1204) - a Jewish rabbi and philosopher (sometimes called by his admirers the "second Moses"). He is considered the premier Jewish philosopher of the Middle Ages. Maimonides sought to harmonize faith and reason, and was open to elements of Neo-Platonism. He interpreted the bible allegorically and minimized anthropomorphic (human) characterizations of God.

Horatio W. Dresser (1866-1954) - His parents were students of Quimby. He was graduated from Harvard and later became a Swedenborgian minister. His many writings include *The Christ Ideal*, *The Perfect Whole*, *Spiritual Health and Healing*, *Handbook of the New Thought*, and *The Power of Silence*. He also compiled and edited a selection of Phineas Quimby's works: *The Quimby Manuscripts*. Dresser believed, "Any individual can be, in time, what he [or she] earnestly desires to be, if he [or she] but set his [or her] face steadfastly in the direction of that one thing and bring all his [or her] powers to bear upon its attainment."

Sister Thea Bowman (1937-1990)—African-American Franciscan. Thea Bowman was born in rural Mississippi. As a nun she worked to integrate her Catholic faith and her identity as an African-American woman. Being the only black face in a white religious order she tended to stand out! Rather than conforming to European models, she was determined to express her black cultural identity, but as a Catholic. She earned a doctorate in English, and was known as a spellbinding preacher. In her final struggle with breast cancer, her prayer was "Lord, let me live until I die."

March 31: Rene Descartes (1596 in France – 1650 in Sweden) – Descartes wrote, "God is the First Cause

which must have produced the idea of God in the thinker." Of course, his most famous quote is, "I think, therefore I am." He believed that Mind knows Itself before anything else. He encouraged methodic doubt, saying it "is necessary for honest thought."

April 1: John Boswell (1947 – 1994) - a Yale history professor who wrote about LGBTQ people in church history. His two most well-known books are: *Christianity, Social Tolerance, and Homosexuality*; and, *Same-Sex Unions in Premodern Europe*. He died at age 47 from AIDS-related complications. He joined the Roman Catholic Church as a teenager and attended mass daily until he died even though he disagreed with Catholic official positions on homosexuality.

April 2: St. Mary of Egypt (344 – 421) – according to legend Mary of Egypt was a sexually insatiable libertine who went on an "anti-pilgrimage" to Jerusalem for the sole purpose of having dalliances with pilgrims. She tried to enter a church and an invisible force wouldn't permit her to do so. She then noticed an icon of the Blessed Lady Mary (Mother of the Lord) and dedicated her life to God on the spot. She then was able to enter the church. A "voice" told her that if she were to cross the Jordan she would find rest. She went to a monastery on the bank of the Jordan, made confession and received Holy Communion, and then crossed the river to spend the rest of her days as a hermit. She died alone and wasn't found for a year. When her body was found, it had not begun the decomposition process. The person who found her buried her with the help of a passing lion!
