Service of Proclamation

A reading from the Fourth Gospel (John 20.1-16)

Early in the morning on the first day of the week, while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene came to the tomb and saw that the stone was moved away from the entrance. She ran at once to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one Jesus loved, gasping for breath. "They took the Master from the tomb. We don't know where they've put him."

Peter and the other disciple left immediately for the tomb. They ran, neck and neck. The other disciple got to the tomb first, outrunning Peter. Stooping to look in, he saw the pieces of linen cloth lying there, but he didn't go in. Simon Peter arrived after him, entered the tomb, observed the linen cloths lying there, and the kerchief used to cover his head not lying with the linen cloths but separate, neatly folded by itself. Then the other disciple, the one who had gotten there first, went into the tomb, took one look at the evidence, and believed. No one yet knew from the Scripture that he had to rise from the dead. The disciples then went back home.

But Mary stood outside the tomb weeping. As she wept, she knelt to look into the tomb and saw two angels sitting there, dressed in white, one at the head, the other at the foot of where Jesus' body had been laid. They said to her, "Woman, why do you weep?"

"They took my Master," she said, "and I don't know where they put him." After she said this, she turned away and saw Jesus standing there. But she didn't recognize him.

Jesus spoke to her, "Woman, why do you weep? Who are you looking for?"

She, thinking that he was the gardener, said, "Sir, if you took him, tell me where you put him so I can care for him." Jesus said, "Mary."

Turning to face him, she said: "Rabboni! Teacher!

The Wisdom of Rabbi Rami Shapiro

"I am not a Christian...but I am not willing to give up the resurrection so easily. I have been to the tomb of Joseph of Arimathea. I have seen where Jesus was laid, and where Mary Magdalene discovered him gone. I have stood in that tomb and felt its emptiness, and in that emptiness its power. I have spent moments alone in that place, and I have heard the cry, 'He is risen!' and I have understood it to mean that you and I can rise as well. I have felt the presence of the man, and have been touched by the power of the myth..."

If this is...a story told that with each hearing we might move closer to Truth, then we have to ask not 'what happened,' but 'what does the story mean?'

... Why do the women [of the story] see what the men cannot? Because the nature of the Divine as we experience it is essentially feminine. The embodied God is the Mother God; the universe is God's body; matter is Mater/Mother. The [story] is telling us that if you are to encounter Life you must open to your feminine consciousness, that aspect of your self that resonates to the Whole, that deepest knowing that knows itself to be a part of and never apart from the reality of Life.

Why does Mary see Jesus as a gardener? Because the gardener tills the soil and removes the weeds. This is the task of humanity revealed in Genesis. Jesus the Gardener reminds us to break up the hard packed soil of our lives, to let in the spirit that our body, like God's body, the universe itself, might bring forth great beauty. But when he calls her name, when he enters into the intimacy of I and Thou, she knows him to be more than the Gardener, he is her teacher; the one who shows her how to care for her own garden...

We all seek meaning in the tomb of the dead. We all seek revelation, wisdom, and knowledge in the past. We are obsessed with the known, the conditioned, the fixed, and the frozen. But life lived in the moment is unknown, unconditioned, unfixed, and fluid. The living is not in the past or in the future, but only in the now. When Jesus calls Mary's name he is calling her out of the tomb of the past and into the garden of the present.

Yet the present itself is quickly made past, if held on to. 'Do not hold on to me,' Jesus says to us. That would be another trap. It is not me...but what I teach that matters. This is why she calls him Rabbouni, rabbi, teacher, rather than Adonai, Lord. He does not ask to be worshipped, but heeded...

What does Jesus ask [us to] heed? Many things to be sure, but in the context of Easter one stands out: 'Take up your cross and follow me!'

Why the cross? Because the way to realization requires the death of the ego, the mind obsessed with tombs, the mind that seeks the living among the dead. And follow him where? Not to Golgotha, but beyond it to the resurrection. Jesus is saying, take up the discipline of love and justice, let the ego that fears both be slain on the cross of service, and then body and soul will rise up, out of the tomb of the past into the eternally renewing present that is the Truth you seek...

Where you have taken refuge in despair, you need to hear Jesus call your name. Where your eyes are focused on the tomb, you need to hear Jesus call your name. Where you are trapped in the unfulfilled expectations of the past, you need to hear Jesus call your name.

And when you do you will know that Easter is not...a story of what was, but a revelation of what is, if you would only cease to seek the living among the dead.

In these human words, God's voice is heard.

Thanks be to God.



MURAL DEDICATION - Saturday, May 7, we will have a dedication ceremony for our outdoor mural! The dedication is at 10 am and the artist will be present.

WELLNESS - At Sunshine Cathedral Square, you can receive Covid testing 7 days per week, STI testing twice per month (1st & 3rd Tuesdays 5 pm - 8 pm courtesy of Broward House), food assistance on Wednesdays (until about 1 pm), and grief support twice a month (contact Rev. Dr. Anne Atwell about the grief support group). Condoms are available in our restrooms, vaccinations are encouraged and hand sanitizer can be found at the doorways of the Worship Center.

EASTER - Scripture tell us that the crucifixion and resurrection of Jesus occurred around the time of the Jewish Passover in our hemisphere's spring. Easter was established in western Europe by the First Council of Nicea in 325 CE, as being the first Sunday after the full moon following the vernal equinox, the day from which the hours of sunlight become progressively longer (the light returns). The equinox had been celebrated as a joyous festival of fertility, regrowth and new birth by early civilizations. The pagan symbols of fertility and life (e.g. hares and eggs) were appropriated by Christians as part of their Easter celebrations. The word Easter may be derived from an Anglo-Saxon spring goddess, Eostre.

SAGE – Friendly Visitor Program for LGBTQ seniors at Sunshine Cathedral - the program has been under development and now has a coordinator: Mitchell Zahn. Mitchell has over 35 years of experience with community-based organizations and government agencies, including work with older adults and people living with HIV. He also has had volunteer management experience, and has done a bunch of volunteering himself. More information about this exciting new program will be coming soon.

VOLUNTEER OF THE QUARTER – Sunshine Cathedral's honored volunteer for Q1 2022 is Michael Cruz. Michael is a prayer chaplain, a 9 am usher, and he designs the chancel paraments and some of the vestments our clergy leaders wear. Congratulations Michael for recognition well deserved.

CONTEMPORARY READING – Today's contemporary reading is from perennial wisdom practitioner, religious scholar, and progressive Jewish rabbi Rami Shapiro.

SAINTS OF THE WEEK

April 17: Lillian DeWaters (1883 – 1964) – a Christian Scientist who expanded into broader New Thought. She was known as a spiritual healer. She lectured widely and gave private instruction at the Astor Hotel in NYC. She wrote over 40 books on spirituality. She encouraged: "Remember that some feet will tread all heights now unattained. Why not thine own? Press on! Achieve! Your dominion is ever within thee, waiting your command to set you free."

April 19: Tibira do Maranhão - First indigenous gay martyr of Brazil. The indigenous man was baptized and then executed for sodomy by French missionaries in 1614. Tibira is the first documented case of a person killed for homosexuality in Brazil.

April 20: Rabbi Morris Lichtenstein (1889 – 1938) – building on the ideas of Rabbi A. G. Moses (who believed the healing philosophy of Christian Science was compatible with Judaism and could be offered in a Jewish context), Lichtenstein and his wife Tehilla co-founded the Society for Jewish Science. Jewish Science sees God as a "force" or "energy", practices visualization and affirmations in its healing work, and believes religion has a role to play in healing of mind and body. Unlike Christian Science, Jewish Science does not oppose the use of medicine when it is needed. Some of the Jewish Science beliefs were, overtime, embraced by other branches of Judaism. The Society for Jewish Science still offers services in their own building in NYC.

April 21: Thomas Parker Boyd (1864 – 1936) – Episcopal priest and psychologist. Founded the Society of the Healing Christ. Believed healing was part of the gospel message and should be practiced by the Church. Throughout his life he prayed for the sick and they would often recover. He was a member of the International New Thought Alliance.

April 23: Cesar Chavez (1927-1993)—Farmworker. Raised in a family of Mexican-American migrant workers, Chavez transformed a local labor struggle into a moral cause that challenged the conscience of the nation. He was committed to absolute nonviolence, and was supported by many religious leaders. Inspired by a priest who gave him a passion for justice, and a community activist who taught him how to organize, he became the driving force in founding the United Farmworkers Union.




