Service of Proclamation

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles (19.1-9a)

While Apollos was in Corinth, Paul traveled through the interior regions and came to Ephesus, where he found some disciples. He said to them, "Did you receive the holy Spirit when you became believers?" They replied, "No. We have not even heard that there is a holy spirit." Paul asked, "Then how were you baptized?" They answered, "With the baptism of John."

Paul said, "John baptized with the baptism of repentance, telling the people to believe in the one who was to come after him, that is, Jesus." On hearing this, they were baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus. When Paul had laid his hands on them, the holy Spirit came upon them... There were about twelve of them in all.

Paul then entered the synagogue, and during the next three months he...argued persuasively about the realm of God. But some remained stubborn in their disbelief and began to malign the Way publicly. So he withdrew from them, taking the disciples with him...

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles (19.19-41)

[In response to Paul's preaching and teaching], a great number of those who practiced magic collected their books [about magic] and burned them publicly. When the value of these books was calculated, it was found to come to fifty thousand silver pieces. In such ways did the word about the Lord Jesus spread ever more widely...

About that time, a serious disturbance broke out concerning the Way. A man named Demetrius was a silver-smith who crafted silver shrines of Artemis that provided considerable employment for the craftsmen. He called a meeting of these artisans and of those in similar trades, and addressed them: "As you know, our prosperity depends upon this business. And as you can now see and hear, not only in Ephesus but also throughout most of the province of Asia, this Paul has persuaded and turned away a considerable number of people by insisting that gods fashioned by human hands are not gods.

Therefore, we are facing a dangerous situation. Not only may our business be discredited, but it could also happen that the temple of the great goddess Artemis will become an object of scorn, and that she who is worshiped throughout the province of Asia and the entire world will be deprived of her greatness."

When they heard this, they became enraged and began to shout, "Great is Artemis of the Ephesians!"

The entire city was in an uproar, and the people all rushed to the theater, dragging along with them Gaius and Aristarchus, Macedonians who were Paul's traveling companions. Paul wanted to appear before the crowd, but the disciples would not permit him to do so. Even some officials of the province of Asia who were friendly to him sent him a message urging him not to venture into the theater.

Meanwhile...the assembly was in an uproar, and most of the people had no idea why they had all come together. Some of the crowd prompted Alexander, who had been pushed forward. Then Alexander motioned for silence and tried to offer some type of defense. However, as soon as the crowd recognized him to be Jewish [faithful to the Hebrew understanding of God], all of them shouted in unison for about two hours, "Great is Artemis of the Ephesians!"

Finally, the town clerk quieted the crowd and said, "Citizens of Ephesus, is there anyone who does not know that the city of the Ephesians is the guardian of the temple of the great Artemis and of her statue that descended from heaven? Since these things cannot be denied, you ought to remain calm and do nothing rash. These men whom you have brought here are not temple robbers, nor have they uttered any blasphemy against our goddess.

Therefore, if Demetrius and his fellow artisans have a complaint against anyone, the courts are open, and proconsuls are available. Let them bring charges there against one another. If there are further charges to present, let these be settled in the lawful assembly. As it is, we are in danger of being charged with rioting today. There is no reason for it, and we will be unable to offer any justification for this commotion."

When he had said this, he dismissed the assembly.

BK Hipsher – Virtual Minister. Dr. Hipsher leads our “virtual” congregation in Second Life. Preaches, leads worship, and provides Pastoral Care. Ordained: Metropolitan Community Churches with standing in the International Council of Community Churches. BS, California Coast University; MATS, Episcopal Divinity School; Advanced Certificate, EDS; DMin, EDS.

Don Eastman – The Reverend Elder Don Eastman has been the pastor of MCC Dallas, the Executive Pastor of MCC Toronto, and the Gap Pastor of Founder's MCC (Los Angeles). He is the retired Vice Moderator of Metropolitan Community Churches and for many years has been Sunshine Cathedral's Systems and Leadership consultant and a coach to both the Senior and Executive ministers of Sunshine Cathedral. He is a graduate of Central Bible College and was awarded an honorary doctorate by The Samaritan Institute. He was an Assemblies of God pastor before joining the MCC movement.

Kurt Krieger – a graduate of Westmar University and St. Paul School of Theology, Rev. Krieger is a retired pastor and chaplain. He is involved with Food Sharing, bell choir, and chancel ministries. He is ordained in Metropolitan Community Churches.

Marian Cavagnaro – In addition to Science and Management degrees, Rev. Cavagnaro holds a religion

degree from Light University (now known as The Samaritan Institute) and a Master of Divinity degree from Florida Center for Theological Studies. She served as a Board member, a SC Foundation governor (and Heritage Board member), and a Cathedral deacon before entering professional ministry. She served as the Assistant Pastor of another church before returning to Sunshine Cathedral where she actively volunteers. She is also a Hospice chaplain and medical laboratory professional. Ordained: Metropolitan Community Churches.

Renwick Bell – is a full-time Hospice chaplain and former pastor. He is active in pastoral care, justice, and music ministries at Sunshine Cathedral. He holds a Master of Divinity degree from Florida Center for Theological Studies. Ordained: Metropolitan Community Churches.

Lynda Pantoja – Rev. Pantoja holds a B.S. from the University of Puerto Rico and a Master's degree from The Samaritan Institute. She is also a graduate of Sacred Journeys Seminary. She is ordained as a Divine Science minister and as an Interfaith minister. She is a Cathedral Board member as well as being part of the chancel ministry.

Margarita Rodriguez – BA, Kings College; Certificate, St. Thomas University; graduate studies, Florida Center for Theological Studies; MRS, The Samaritan Institute. Rev. Rodriguez is a faculty member for the Samaritan Institute, a chancel minister, the Cathedral's Minister of Spiritual Companionship, and serves as the Chaplain for the Divine Science Federation International. She is an ordained Divine Science minister.

Nancy Davis – Dr. Davis is a therapist with a Master of Social Work degree. She is also an ordained Interfaith Minister with a Master of Divinity degree and a Doctor of Divinity degree, both from All Faiths Seminary. Dr. Davis teaches A Course in Miracles.

Ed Huckemeyer – Dr. Huckemeyer is an ordained Deacon at the Sunshine Cathedral. Ed teaches a writing class and is both the Minister of Pastoral Care for Sunshine Cathedral, and our Sacristan. Deacon Ed leads monthly worship at a local Assisted Living facility. Ed holds three Master's degrees, the third one being a religious degree from The Samaritan Institute. Deacon Ed also holds a Doctor of Divinity degree (earned) from TSI.

Jean Johnson – a retired realtor, Jean holds an Associate's degree from Light University (now known as The Samaritan Institute) and is an ordained Sunshine Cathedral Deacon. She has served on the Cathedral Board of Directors and on the SC Foundation's Board of Governors. She is our Community Chaplain.

Lydia Chapman – Deacon Lydia is a leader in the Food Sharing ministry and also in women's ministries. She is an ordained deacon and also a certified Divine Science Practitioner. Deacon Lydia is a graduate of The Samaritan Institute.

Michael Karban – Michael is an ordained Deacon at Sunshine Cathedral. Deacon Michael holds a Master of Theological Studies degree from The Samaritan Institute

(as well as a B.A. in Sociology from FAU) and is our Minister of the Chancel.

Sue Gallagher – Dr. Gallagher is a Teaching Associate at Sunshine Cathedral and an ordained Deacon. Deacon Sue holds a B.A. in Religious Studies (Siena College), an M.A. in Pastoral Ministries (St. Thomas U.), and an Ed.D. in Adult Education (FIU).

CONTEMPORARY READING – There is not a contemporary reading today. Both readings are from the Acts of the Apostles, chapter 19 (New Testament).

SAINTS OF THE WEEK

May 22: Rabbi Baal Shem Tov (1700-1760)— Founder of Hasidism. He proclaimed a mysticism of the everyday. In each task and moment there is a spark of the divine holiness of God. The spirit in which one lives is more important than following a set of laws. Although most were murdered by the Nazis, vibrant Hasidic communities thrive today in Israel and the US.

Harvey Milk (1930 – 1978) - visionary civil and human rights leader who became one of the first openly gay elected officials in the United States when he won a seat on the San Francisco Board of Supervisors in

1977. His political career was cut short when he was assassinated nearly a year after taking office.

May 24: Julia Seton Sears (1862-1950) - Founder of the New Civilization Church. She was a metaphysical teacher known to both Ernest and Fenwicke Holmes. She was both a metaphysical healer and also a medical doctor. Her books include *Helpful Thoughts*, *The Science of Success*, *The Mystic’s Goal*, and *The Key to Health, Wealth, and Love*. She stated, “There is nothing in all the world but life! Even Death itself is only life acting inversely.”

Stormé DeLarverie - a biracial “butch” lesbian drag king entertainer and one of those credited with starting the Stonewall Rebellion that launched the modern LGBTQ liberation movement. She died on May 24, 2014 at the age of 93.

May 25: Rosa Bonheur - the most famous female painter of the 19th century, wore men’s clothing honored what she called the “androgynous Christ.” She had lesbian relationships. She died on May 25, 1899.

May 26: Anna L. Palmer (1858 - 1944) – ordained by Nona Brooks in 1916, Palmer became president of the Colorado College of Divine Science and editor of *Divine Science Monthly*.

May 27: Prentice Mulford (1834 - 1891) - Author of *Thoughts Are Things*. One of the earliest New Thought pioneers (if not one of the better known). Mulford was a mystic who believed each person must discover Truth for himself or herself. His insights came more from reflection than from study. Some of his insights include: “To say a thing ‘must be’ is the very power that makes it” and “Every thought of yours is a real thing - a force.” At only 57 he died peacefully without any apparent illness or pain.

May 28: John Macquarrie (1919 – 2007) – a former Presbyterian turned Anglican priest and theologian. He has been described as the most distinguished Anglican theologian of the second half of the 20th century. He taught at the University of Glasgow (where he earned his PhD), Union Theological Seminary in NYC, and the Graduate Theological Foundation. He loved and was fully committed to the Christian tradition while also affirming the legitimacy of other traditions and the need to learn from them (though he did not favor syncretism). About non-Christian religions he said, “I do not deny for a moment that the truth of God has reached others through other channels...”

Charles Ludlam (1943 – 1987) – Off-Broadway director, playwright, and actor who founded the Ridiculous Theatre Company in New York City in 1967. Not really religious, Ludlam all the same had a religious like devotion to his art and found spiritual strength, honesty, and empowerment from sharing his art. He was an openly gay man and in 1987 he died from AIDS related complications.
